**Freestanding OASAS Certified Part 822: Clinic, Outpatient Rehabilitation, and, Opioid Treatment (OTP) Programs**

**OASAS APG INTERIM CLAIMS REPROCESSING HAS BEGUN**

**Reprocess Begin Date**

- Beginning the week of November 26, 2012, the first batch of APG interim claims will be reprocessed.
- These reprocessed claims will impact cycle 1841 and has a check and remittance date of December 3, 2012.

**Reprocess Scheduling**

- The APG reprocess will take place in batches, with the oldest claims being processed first and will occur every week until the reprocess is complete.
- Each batch will contain two weeks of claims.
- It is planned to reprocess a batch of claims each week.

**Impacted Dates of Service**

- The APG reprocessing will apply to claims with dates of service:

Clinics and Outpatient Rehabilitation Programs	7/1/2011 – 12/31/2011
Opioid Treatment Programs	7/4/2011 – 1/1/2012

**Application of OASAS Utilization Thresholds (UT)**

- For the impacted dates of service listed above, Utilization Threshold (UT) will be applied at the same time the APG Interim claims are reprocessed.
- For claims with dates of service from 1/1/2012 – 3/31/2012, UT will be applied to these claims once all the APG interim claims have been reprocessed.

**Correcting APG Interim Claims:**

Once the reprocessing has been completed by DOH, programs will be responsible for their own reprocessing of claims that were denied upon initial submission or during the DOH reprocessing.

When resubmitting reprocessed claims, the program would use the appropriate APG rate code in the claim header.


